Dear Parents/Guardians of Secondary 2 to 4 Students,

Re: Parents' Seminars on "Senior Secondary Curriculum and Subject Choices"
(for Parents/Guardians of Students Currently Studying S2 to S4)

The broad and balanced senior secondary curriculum caters for students' diverse learning needs, fosters whole-person development and promotes lifelong learning. The measures to optimise the four senior secondary core subjects (i.e. Chinese Language, English Language, Mathematics, and Citizenship and Social Development which replaces Liberal Studies) have been introduced in this school year starting from Secondary 4 to create space for students and cater for their diverse learning and development needs. In order to reduce social contact and thus effectively contain the potential spread of COVID-19 in the community, the parents' seminars on "Senior Secondary Curriculum and Subject Choices" for this school year will be pre-recorded as in the past two years.

The seminars are conducted in both Cantonese and English*. The content includes an overview of senior secondary curriculum and subject choices, optimisation of the four senior secondary core subjects, the latest developments of Citizenship and Social Development and Applied Learning courses, an overview of the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination, and alternative pathways for further studies – options available to be presented by representatives of the Education Bureau, Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority, and Vocational Training Council. The videos and the presentation slides of the seminars will be uploaded to the New Academic Structure Web Bulletin (www.edb.gov.hk/nas/en) of the Education Bureau in mid-March 2022 for viewing and reference of parents/guardians of Secondary 2 to 4 students. Parents/Guardians may visit the above website to gain a better understanding of the latest developments of the senior secondary curriculum in order to assist their children in making informed subject choices.
