We are pleased to inform you that the Harvard Prize Book 2023 is now open for school nomination. The details of the Harvard Prize Book, Scholarship and Essay Award are as follows:

Harvard Prize Book

The Harvard Club of Hong Kong Education Fund awards book prizes annually to three students per school. Each school can nominate up to *three Secondary 5 students* for their academic excellence in English and significant contributions to school in the previous academic year. Only the three nominees from each school are eligible to apply for the Scholarship and Essay Award.

Essay Award

Applicants will have to write a 500-word essay on the following topic:

The past few years have brought the digital world into focus, with growing apps and platforms that create opportunities for virtual connection. This digital revolution has helped us connect to a greater number of people than we could in our immediate surroundings. But some argue that these connections are superficial, and cannot match the quality and depth of physical bonds.

Physical communities bring people together, provide a sense of belonging, and imbue us with purpose and meaning. Sometimes, physical communities grow naturally through shared values and consistent connection. Other times, these physical communities or tribes take a more dedicated effort to build and sustain.

Describe a time when you took an active role in building your physical community or tribe. What circumstances inspired you to take action? What were some challenges that you faced, and how did you overcome them? What lessons have you learned from this experience that you can use in the future to bring people together and foster belonging?

Winners of the Essay Award will have their essay published on the Harvard Prize Book website.

Scholarship

The 2023 Harvard Prize Book Scholarship Winner will receive HKD 10,000. Scholarship winners are determined by need and merit. Students from families with an average monthly household income of HKD 40,000 and below are welcomed to apply for the Scholarship. Students who do not meet this requirement should apply for the Essay Award. Scholarship applicants will have to write a 500-word essay on the above topic and write a 250-word response to each of the following three short questions:

- 1. What did you do last summer during your break? Please share a highlight.
- 2. If you were awarded the HK\$10,000 Scholarship prize money, what would you do with it? Please be reminded there are no right or wrong answers!
- 3. If you had unlimited time or money, what would you like to learn and why?
